ONLINE PROPERTY TAX RECEIPTS NOW AVAILABLE

Austin, TX – If you paid taxes in the month of January, your property tax receipt is available at www.traviscountytax.org. Property tax receipts will no longer be mailed automatically once property taxes are paid in full. Instead taxpayers are encouraged to access their receipts online.

“Payments postmarked on Jan. 31 have been delivered by the post office and processed by our office.” says Bruce Elfant, Travis County Tax Assessor-Collector. “Once a payment has been made, the receipt is available the next business day. We no longer have to wait for paper, printing and postage, making it easier than ever for customers to get the information they need to file their federal income taxes.”

Last year, 397,000 receipts were mailed to property owners at a cost of nearly \$85,000. The Texas Property Tax Code does not require receipts be mailed and instead allows the tax office to provide them upon request. Online receipts are environmentally friendly, reduce costs, and allow taxpayers access to information outside of the tax office’s normal business hours.

Paper receipts and receipts for partial payments will still be available by including a request with the payment, calling (512) 854-9473, emailing tax_office@co.travis.tx.us, or visiting any tax office location.
